Often, young people in state care have difficulties adapting to everyday life once they leave the child protection state system. They often lack the necessary independent living skills, emotional stability, and vocational qualifications needed to navigate the labour market successfully. Many struggle with unemployment, financial difficulties, and even homelessness.	
	To address these issues, it is vital to provide them with stability, which includes access to reference persons who can offer guidance and mentorship. Equipping them with the skills to live independently, manage personal and financial assets, and secure independent housing is essential. Additionally, offering vocational training, employment opportunities, and support for enhancing social skills, health, and psychological well-being can help them build a more promising future. These young adults also require specialised understanding and acceptance from professionals to strengthen their self-esteem and personal autonomy as they transition into adulthood.

Equipping children leaving state care with the skills to live independently, manage personal and financial assets, and secure independent housing is essential. Providing integrated service packages for a minimum number of 52 children and/or young people from Cluj-Napoca and Satu Mare counties who are to leave the institutionalised child protection system and/or who have left the institutionalised child protection system in order to ensure the transition from the institutionalised system to community-level services.

Payment of rent for up to 24 months Social, psychological, and financial counselling Labour market insertion services Professional training and incentives for attending different training courses within the project Activities to develop life skills which prepare young people for living independently and to support them in managing their household after they no longer benefit from support Mentoring scheme with the support of mentors, some of whom are young people who have been through the same state system and are now fully integrated.
