Context/ Social issues addressed Please explain the problem you attempt to solve.	According to the World Health Organisation, there were 47.5 million people living with dementia worldwide in 2016 , of whom between 28.5 and 33.3 mil had Alzheimer's disease. The rate of increase of dementia disease indicates that any action taken to slow down the dementia process and keep the patient in the home environment for as long	

as possible is important at an individual level for the patient and their family and socioeconomically in terms of the burden of having to provide institutional care. In this context, the Masovian Social Policy Centre started a pilot project for older people suffering from dementia. The pilot project covered 6 locations in the Masovian Province. The project was funded solely by the Masovian Provincial Government and amounted to approximately **€4 million**. A further reduction to a level of 7.4% is expected by 2025. > It has been decided to increase the number of DCCs from 6 to 12 and to raise the budget to approximately EUR 8 mil by the end of 2025. > The total expected amount of patients to be covered by the project until 2025 is 400.
