Context/ Social issues addressed	The West Athens Functional Urban Area (WA FUA) faces significant social challenges in the light of traditional key risks related to unemployment, poverty and housing insecurity. In addition, the demographic ageing and the awakening of family

support leads to the development of the so-called social care crisis, not adequately addressed by the current fragmented national social care model in Greece. Social care is managed by the state through a decentralized system with public and private non-profit providers, but this structure lacks standardization, effective monitoring and sufficient funding, leading to inadequate coverage for basic needs and inconsistent access to services.

In response, the WA FUA designed the Resilient West Athens 2021-2027 Strategy to address these gaps. This Strategy covers nine municipalities with shared socioeconomic characteristics and will be implemented during 2024-2029 under a 76.000.000 € financial mechanism, monitored by the West Athens Development Agency (a legal body of private law created by Municipalities in the West Athens area) and its nine founding Municipalities, with the support of the University of West Attica and relevant public bodies and civil society actors.

This funding is part of the Regional Operational Programme "ATTICA" within the context of the Greek Partnership Agreement 2021-2027. It will support particular the Policy Objective 5 "A Europe closer to citizens by fostering the sustainable and integrated development of all types of territories and local initiatives" of the EU Cohesion Policy 2021-2027, as laid down in article 5 and specified in articles 28-34 of the EU Regulation 2021/1060 (http://data.europa.eu/eli/reg/2021/1060/oj).

SARL UNIWA was responsible for drafting the Social Agenda of the Strategy, using regulatory analysis, functional comparative analysis, qualitative and quantitative methods, focus group surveys with stakeholders and target groups and open consultation methods. This Agenda aims to improve social service quality and inclusivity in the region through a €16 million budget. It targets vulnerable groups, including minimum income beneficiaries, people with disabilities, children, Roma, and migrants, with actions such as establishing new care centres, training social services staff, and creating research observatories.
