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Transforming senior centres into civic and community centres implied pursuing the following challenges:

- Promoting multigenerational, intergenerational and multipurpose spaces that become meeting points for everyone.
- Build a model of civic and community centres characterised by versatility and intergenerationally, without displacing anyone and avoiding isolation, that integrates and helps social cohesion and assumes inclusive policies and equal opportunities for everyone.
- Train the leading staff in the centres to assume the new character of multigenerational relationships. Assist the participants through the centre's transformation and new ways of understanding it and its relationships. Create synergies between territory agents, coordinating shared programs and projects.

The civic and community centres find their primordial mission to be the community's backbone. They put diverse resources and services at people's disposal that improve the citizens' quality of life, support social cohesion, equity, rootedness and the feeling of belonging, and transmit civic values. They are non-religious, public spaces open to everyone.

## Activities:

The new <u>Decree 46/2022</u>, of <u>March 15th</u>, on <u>civic and community centres</u> comes at a time when almost all facilities have become community spaces. Despite this, it was necessary to redefine the objectives of these centres to configure a model that would provide services and respond to the ever-changing realities and needs of the population while also consolidating this transformation from senior centres to civic and community centres.

This new model is based on community methodology, inclusive policies and practices, and equal opportunities. It also promotes the strengthening of generational and intercultural ties and seeks to reinforce the culture of civility by offering welcoming and meeting spaces with appropriate services and resources. The Unit of Programming and Dynamisation of Activities, bearing the responsibility of this task, decidedly works to increase the quality of the service these centres provide to all citizens in Catalonia, considering the specificity of each territory and connecting it to the world. Considering that this task and services have been satisfactorily consolidated, we believe that the project becomes a historic institutional opportunity, especially for older people, to move towards the development and improvement of the quality of life and inclusion in the community.

Some activities that have been particularly successful are:

- Intercultural and intergenerational project "Beware the Jabberwock", in collaboration with the entity "La Víbria Intercultural" (<a href="https://vibria.org/">https://vibria.org/</a>)
- Intergenerational project "(S)àvies" (meaning: Wise/Grandmothers), in collaboration with La Sagrera Sant Andreu High School.

Our project aims at the integral development of every individual and the prevention of social exclusion by guaranteeing the reinforcement of intergenerational and intercultural relations, civility culture and adequate services and resources in welcoming and meeting spaces. It also tries to give an answer to new realities and social needs, guaranteeing dynamism and adaptability to the territory's characteristics, preventing social isolation. We firmly believe that this is possible by putting different generations in contact, and allowing the centre to be the space where these relations take place.
<ul> <li>To achieve these goals, we recommend: <ul> <li>Actively accompanying the centres' heads, which translates into careful attention to their needs, diagnoses and understanding of the territory.</li> <li>Implementing programs specifically for children and youth, in order to guarantee their presence in the centre.</li> <li>Promoting intergenerational activities such as those presented above.</li> <li>Carefully considering the environment's needs (whether the neighbourhood, municipality, or broader territory).</li> <li>Securing equity in treatment independently from origin, age, gender, sexual orientation, etc.</li> <li>Keeping a close contact with entities from the social sector localized or working in the territory of adscription of the centre.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
