This will be the disclaimer of your	This project outlines the coordinated response by the General Council of Social Work and GEIES following the DANA floods in Valencia on October 29, 2024. Backed by a €700,000 grant, it delivers biopsychosocial and community-based care to affected populations. GEIES (Spanish Association of Social Workers) mobilised over 450 professionals for emergency and post-emergency interventions in the most impacted municipalities. The initiative also includes hiring specialised staff to support long-term recovery and strengthen local social services. Additionally, it incorporates training,

This project has two phases and different activities included in each of them.

• Phase 1 of Emergency: Action of the GEIES

For the past five years, the GEIES has been operating in real-life emergencies: volcanic eruptions, storms, fires, floods, earthquakes, and droughts. The GEIES's role lies in organising and coordinating emergency social intervention groups of professional associations, advising the relevant authorities, training professionals, proposing actions to improve post-emergency care for victims, and developing protocols and tools. In response to this latest major catastrophe, the GEIES was activated on October 30th. After learning about the situation in the various affected municipalities, the General Council offered its assistance by supporting the professionals and the public. Government agencies were contacted to support the humanitarian response; and information gathering, documentation, and dissemination efforts began.

The GEIES (Spanish Association of Social Workers) worked with 56 emergency professionals for 20 days, coordinated by the Valencia Association, in support of the Social Services of the affected municipalities, with on-site interventions. This first phase of the intervention focused on immediate response, social triage, and emergency care by the GEIES' social work teams specialising in Social Emergency Intervention. Interventions were carried out with the affected organisations and individuals, identifying and assessing situations of special vulnerability at the individual, family, and community levels, especially related to basic needs such as shelter and housing, food, water, reunification, basic resources, support networks, and more. Support was also provided in the planning and organisation of emergency situations in the Social Services, and support and care were provided to the social workers of Social Services.

• Phase 2: Post-Emergency Interventions

Field intervention through the incorporation of social workers as support and accompaniment at the Social Service Centres in the main towns affected by the DANA on October 29. Care for people affected by social emergency situations is provided by social work teams specialising in Social Emergency Intervention.

- 5 groups of 3 people from GEIES activated.
- Emergency teams of 5 people from 7 Official Colleges of Social Work that are part of the GEIES (Aragon, Madrid, Catalonia, Murcia, Balearic Islands, Andalusian Council, Cáceres) have been activated.
- Collaboration of the Official Colleges of Castellón and Alicante.
- 56 GEIES personnel intervening in the affected areas.
- More than 300 social work professionals were activated by the Official College of Social Work of Valencia.
- Performance in Paiporta, Alfafar, Bennetusser, Masanasa, Sedaví, Aldaia, Catarroja.

	This result is based on community support through the reinforcement of Social Services. • Hiring a team of specialist social workers to intervene in post-emergency situations. • Attention to the population. • Interventions for managing social harm, identifying needs, creating and developing support networks, and providing grief care and support, etc. • Organisation of local groups and resources. • Community training and social fabric. • Identification of vulnerability at the community level. • Systematisation of practice through participatory action research in the municipalities of Letur and Mira.
